




† A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Glory to you, O Lord.

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them. "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this,

it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

LETTER FROM BISHOP TO PARISHIONERS OF TRANSFIGURATON OF THE LORD PARISH APRIL 15-16, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

I want to wish the entire Transfiguration of the Lord Parish a Happy and Blessed Easter and to share with you an important update regarding your parish.

As you know, since last August, Father Rodney Thibault has been on administrative leave, and I want to acknowledge the distress you have experienced because of that. I am grateful to Father Michael Ciryak for assuming the responsibilities of temporary parochial administrator and to Deacon Joseph Regali and the entire parish staff with whom he worked to ably shepherd this community through a difficult time.

I want to inform you that the investigation into the allegation of misconduct made against Father Thibault is nearing its conclusion.

At this time, I also want to inform you that Father Thibault has decided to resign as the pastor of Transfiguration of the Lord Parish, and I have accepted it. While difficult, his decision to resign is one with which I agree is in the best interest of the parish.

A large and vibrant parish like yours needs a permanent leader, so I am pleased to announce the appointment of Father David A. Costa as the new Pastor of Transfiguration of the Lord Parish. Father Costa is certainly well known to all of you, having served the Catholic community of North Attleboro for many years before beginning an assignment outside the area in 2019. He will return well familiar with you and the area and be ready to lead your parish. His appointment will become effective on Wednesday, June 21, 2023. Until then, Father Ciryak will continue to serve you.

As we celebrate this Second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday, our Lord comes to us once again in the same way as today's Gospel and says, "Peace be with you." May we all hear his voice and receive his peace.

I thank you for your goodness, generosity, patience, and understanding throughout this time. Likewise, I wish to extend again a word of gratitude to Father Ciryak and your Parish Staff and volunteers for steadfastly moving your parish forward in these past months.

Please be assured of my prayers for the gift of Christ's Easter peace to you, your families, and your wonderful parish as you prepare to move forward with your new pastor.
